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What is this leaflet about?

New legislation, in the form of the Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014, came into force on 1 April 2015. The Act requires health boards and local authorities to integrate a range of health and social care services.

Health and social care partnerships work together to improve people's experience of services, and give people the support they need to live safe, healthy lives in their own communities.

This leaflet explains why people involved in your care in the health and social care partnerships may need to share information about you in order to provide the services and support you need.

Who is involved in looking after your information?

The NHS and local authority health and social care partners work together to provide you with services designed to meet your needs. To allow them to provide the most appropriate support they need to share some of your personal health and social care information.

Keeping you informed

In accordance with the Public Bodies (joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014 consent will not be required for the sharing of information between NHS Ayrshire & Arran and each of the three local authorities in Ayrshire for the purpose of delivering joined up health and social care services.

You will, however, be informed about how your information will be collected, held and shared. This will ensure that we can deliver co-ordinated care that is easy to access and is focussed on the best outcome for you.

What can you expect from us?

We will only hold and share information that is needed to provide the support you require. We will keep this information, along with details of the support you require, in strict confidence.

If you require more information about your support plan or the sharing of information within the health and social care partnerships, then please contact your key worker.

Statement of confidentiality

Everyone working within the NHS and the local authorities has a professional and legal duty to keep information about you confidential and secure. We will not share this information outside the health and social care partnerships unless authorised to do so, either with your consent or by law.

The laws that govern the use of your information are the Data Protection Act 2018, the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), the Human Rights Act 1998, along with professional standards and codes of conduct and the common law on privacy and confidentiality. The health and social care partnerships may share personal data with other public bodies where required by law, for the prevention or detection of crime or the protection of children and vulnerable adults.
